# Bible background

Luke 9:10-17; John 6:1-13

#### Aim of lesson

- (a) To show that Jesus can do miracles, and
- (b) To encourage the children to thank God for the food he supplies.

#### **Preparation required**

Prepare one activity sheet by colouring, cutting lengthwise, taping into one long strip and folding, concertina fashion, into a booklet. You will need colouring materials, tape and scissors during the lesson. Get to know the rhyme well, and place a copy where you can glance at it while still keeping your eyes on the children.

# Suggested outline of lesson

- 1. Hold the booklet up to show the class one page at a time, and read the rhyme, stopping to discuss what is happening, and to ask the class what they would have done, felt or thought.
- 2. Read through the rhyme with the booklet again, allowing the children to supply the last word of each couplet.
- 3. Go through each page of the booklet again asking the children to tell you what is happening at each picture.
- 4. Help the class to make their own booklet. As they colour each picture ask questions and discuss the lesson again.
- 5. Ask each child to hold up the correct page of their booklet as you go through the rhyme again. Encourage them to join in as they remember it.

## **Alternative activities**

- 1. Make loaves and fishes out of play dough. Make card/play dough baskets to put them in.
- 2. Cut sponges into fish and loaf shapes and do some printing.
- 3. Dress up and have an indoor picnic (fish shaped sweets add to the fun!)

### Relevance to the children's lives

Encourage the children to be grateful for the food God gives them.

#### **Prayer**

Ask what the boy with the loaves and fishes might have prayed that night, or the people who werefed.

#### Verse

'Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven he gave thanks.' Matthew 14:19.
