ACTIVITIES AND GAMES

Activity 1: What do you know about Jesus? (10-20 minutes)

Aim

To enable the children to demonstrate what they have learned and understood about the life of Jesus. To allow you to identify any areas of misunderstanding.

Equipment needed

Paper and crayons for the extension activity.

Instructions

- This is a memory game similar to 'I went to the shops and I bought...'
- The first person (it's probably best if you go first) has to say something about Jesus, e.g. 'Jesus was born in Bethlehem'
- The next person repeats this statement and then adds a fact of their own, e.g. 'Jesus
 was born in Bethlehem and shepherds came to see him'
- Continue around the circle providing a prompt as necessary.
- If you have a small group you may be able to go around the circle 2 or 3 times.
- Don't worry about chronological order or if the children stray on to facts from lessons not yet covered.
- It may help to pass a small toy around the circle so that everyone knows whose turn it
 is.

Extension activity:

If you have time, you could ask the children to draw a picture to illustrate their fact(s). You could write (or help them to write) their fact underneath.

Activity 2: Dice Game (15-20 minutes)

Aim

To help the children to learn the names of the 12 disciples.

Equipment needed

You will need a set of Unit 3: Dice Game cards for each child. The pictures will need to be cut out in advance. You will also need 1 or 2 dice.

Instructions

Place the sets of pictures in the middle. The children take turns to roll the dice and collect the corresponding picture. The first person to collect all 12 is the winner. To speed up the game use 2 dice; don't add the scores but allow the player to choose which number to use. This increases the chances of getting the required picture. The pictures do not have to be collected in sequence but each player can only collect 1 of each picture. If you are short of time, set a time limit e.g. 10 minutes, and see who has collected the most pictures.


