Mirror Writing



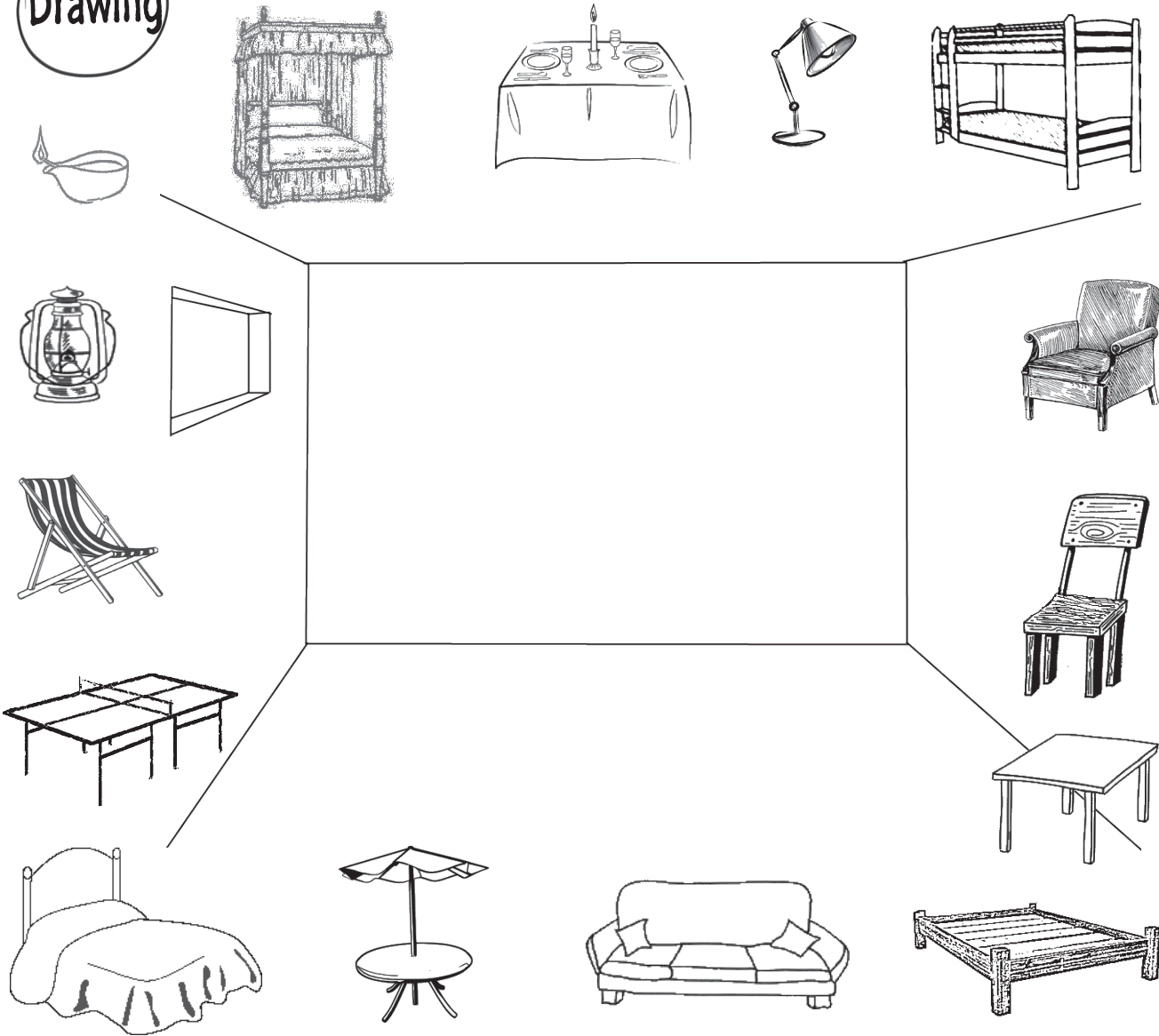
