Activities and Games

Activity 1: Words and Pictures

Aim

The aim of the game is to describe, using mime, pictures or verbal descriptions, the story on each card and then to identify the principle being taught in each story.

Equipment Needed

- Words and Pictures sheets printed onto card and cut out into 14 individual pictures
- Words and Pictures answer sheet, either one for each child or one for a group of children Paper and pencils

Instructions


- 1. Place all the cards in a bag or face down on the table.
- 2. Taking it in turns each pupil takes a card and either mimes, draws or tells the story omitting the stated words. The code on the card determines whether it is a mime, drawing or telling the story and which words have to be omitted. The others have to guess which lesson or story it is.

Μ	Mime
D	Draw (like Pictionary)
S	Tell the story without saying the words marked on the card

- 3. As each story is guessed the answers are written on the Words and Pictures answer sheet against the correct numbers.
- 4. Once all the stories have been written down the children are then to match up the Bible principles on their sheet which match the stories they have written down, as shown in the completed table overleaf. Obviously these are not the only lessons we can learn from each story so you may need to discuss the answers.






Activity 2: Jesus and John

Aim

To complete the game by answering the questions correctly and moving forward to the 'Saved' line

Equipment Needed

- Board game, printed on to card and enlarged if possible
- 2 sets of 7 counters each
- Jesus and John question sheet

Instructions

- 1. This is a game for 2 players or 2 teams. Ask each player or team a question. If answered correctly, the player or team can move forward one space.
- 2. The player or team who have the most counters on the 'Saved' line wins the game. The numbers on the board correspond to the numbered sections in the questions.

It might be worth emphasizing to the children that this is just a game and that our salvation doesn't actually depend on answering questions.

3. John the Baptist
