TOday Bethel is an Arab village called Beit El.






Take a length of A4 paper and cut it in half lengthways.

Starting at the bottom fold it up every 1.5 cm. Mark and cut out as Figure 1.






Open out the ladder as in Figure 2

Make at least two angels. To make one angel you will need a pipe cleaner and two wire bag ties.

FOID a pipe cleaner in half making a loop for the head. Twist the rest for the body. Thread the ties through the pipe cleaner and twist once round the body for arms and legs (Figure 3).



Using the pattern (Figure 4) CUt 2 coat shapes of coloured paper and stick to both sides of the angel.



GIUE the ladder to dark blue or black paper or card at top and bottom only. For descending angels hook an arm over a rung; for ascending ones hook a leg over a rung.
