They set the ark of God on a cart.

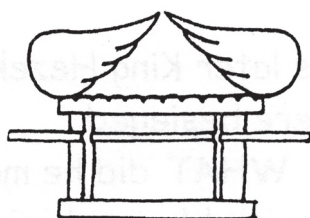
As the cart went along the oxen stumbled

They carried the ark properly and brought it to Jerusalem.

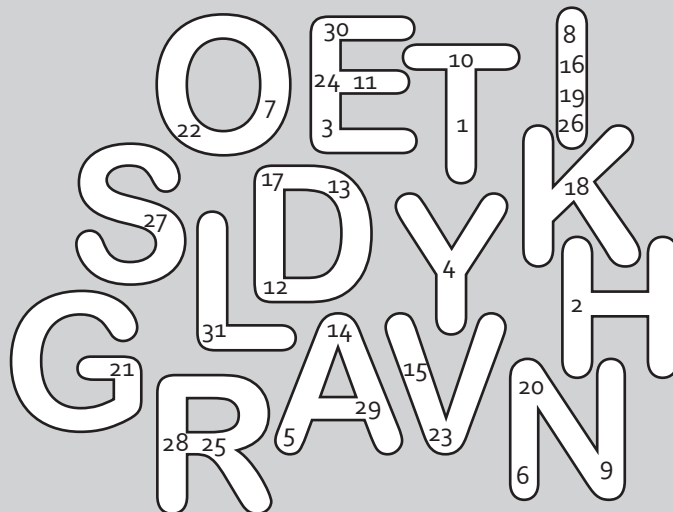
God struck Uzzah down and he died. David was afraid.

Choose one of the scenes above and draw a picture. We have drawn the ark for you.

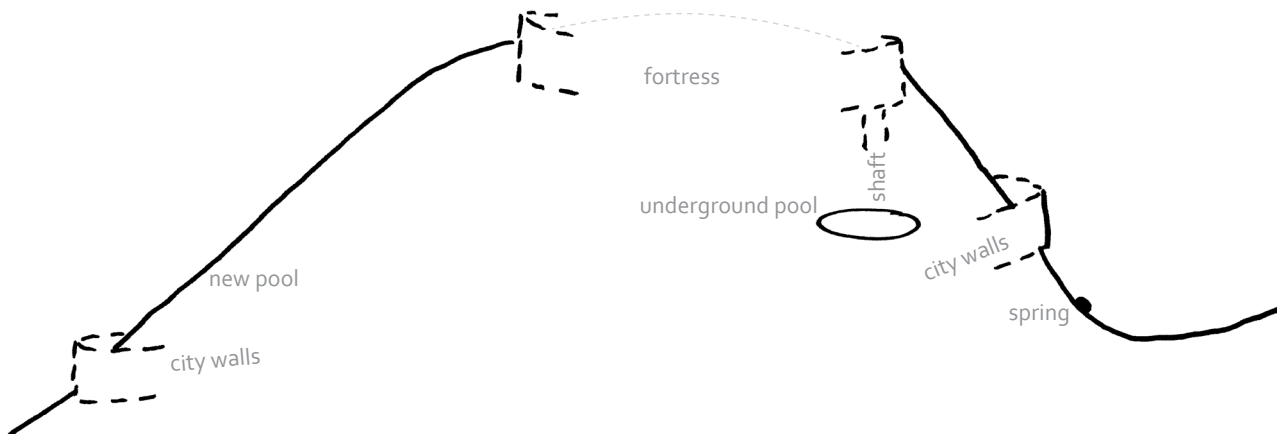

Jerusalem

was built on a hill like the one below. Before David captured the city the Jebusites had built a fortress on the top. **Draw the fortress** with a black pen or pencil. Underneath the city there was a pool, and water ran underground from the pool to a spring outside the walls. **Colour the pool blue**, and show water running down to the spring. Unfortunately the spring was outside the city, so the Jebusites dug a shaft from the fortress to the pool. **Finish drawing the shaft.**

You will need:

Card, stiff paper, glue, crayons, scissors.

You can either

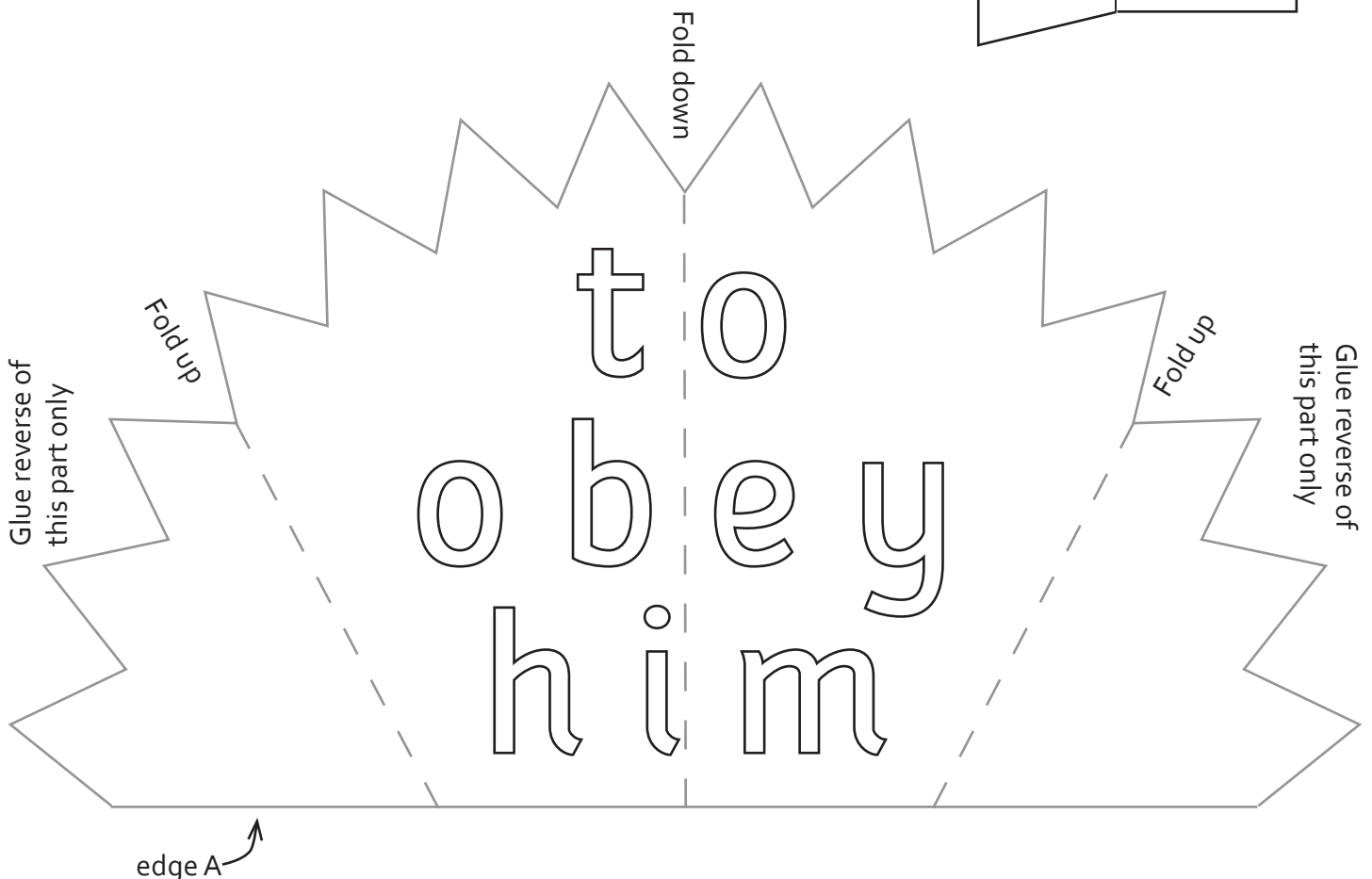
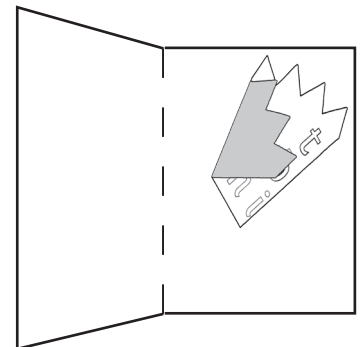
1. download these sheets from the website www.cssu.org.uk/oljn3.htm and print this page straight onto the sheet of stiff paper and the next page onto the sheet of card, or
2. cut round the shape on this page and stick it onto the piece of stiff paper and the shape on the next page onto the sheet of card.

In either case you could just cut the shape on this page from paper.

What to do:

1. Cut round the shapes on your card and paper noting the instructions on the paper shape below.
2. Fold the card in half.
3. Colour the lettering on both the card and the paper.

4. Fold the paper shape along the fold lines and glue the right hand side.
5. Stick the paper shape inside the card in the top right hand corner as shown. The two points of the insert should nearly touch the edges of the card, and edge A (see below) should be parallel with the bottom of the card.
6. Glue the other side and close the card so that both sides stick.
7. Leave to dry and open gently the first time.
