

Learning the names of the disciples

You will need:

A piece of plain A4 paper and some scissors and crayons.

What to do:

1. Cut paper in half lengthways (you should have two pieces 105mm by 297mm).
2. Fold each piece concertina fashion into six equal parts.
3. Cut out Figure 1 and place it onto one of the folded papers.
4. Trace around the shape and cut out the shaded area through all thicknesses. Ensure that all six parts remain joined at the top and bottom.
5. Repeat this for the other piece of paper. You should now have 12 face shapes. Put the disciples' names in the top section and draw a different face for each disciple.
