


It is not the healthy that need a doctor but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous but sinners to repentance.

You will need:

- thin card
- scissors
- crayons
- glue
- paper fastener

What to do:

1. Glue the square and the circle onto thin card (or download this page from the CSSU web site and print it onto card).
2. Carefully cut out the shapes.
3. Cut out the shaded part of the square.
4. Colour the pictures on the wheel and make your own pattern round the border of the square.
5. Make a hole in the centre of the square and the circle and join them together with the paper fastener so that you can turn the wheel to see what was lost.
