Activities and Games

Activity 1: Jumping Jacob! (10 mins)

Aim

To revise key characters and events from lessons 5-13

Equipment Needed

Each student needs one of each character card.

Instructions

- 1. Class sit with their 4 character cards in front of them.
- 2. Teacher reads a statement.
- 3. Students decide whether the statement applies to Abraham, Isaac, Jacob or Joseph and hold up appropriate card as quickly as they can.
- 4. If you want to introduce a competitive element, 1 point could go to the first correct card or take it in turns.


Variations


For a more active game:

Divide students into 4 groups – each group representing a different character. When a statement is read which applies to them they should jump up and shout their name.

Alternatively, place a different name in 4 corners of the room. When a statement is called out students should run to the correct name. The last person to arrive at the name should sit out. Continue until you have a winner.

Activity 2: By Faith... (25 mins)

Aim

To revise key characters, events and chronology of early Genesis

Equipment Needed

Each student should have the 12 statements from the activity sheet, which have been cut up, shuffled and placed in an envelope.

Instructions

- 1. Give an envelope to each student who should then
 - a) complete the names which are missing,
 - b) place the statements in the order in which they appear.
- 2. Read Hebrews 11 v 1 31 to check answers.
- 3. The last four statements are not from lessons in this unit so you may wish to leave them out, depending on your class.

Variations

For a younger group, the activity sheet could be left in chronological order.

As an alternative to using the activity sheet, students should read Hebrews 11 v 1-7 and write their own 'by faith' for Abraham, Jacob and Joseph, using their knowledge of Genesis. It would then be useful to discuss why certain things are included when others are omitted.

By faith offered God a better sacrifice than did. By faith he was commended as a righteous man, when God spoke well of his offerings. And by faith he still speaks, even though he is dead.
By faith, when warned about things not yet seen, in holy fear built an ark to save his family. By his faith he condemned the world and became heir of the righteousness that comes by faith.
By faith was taken from this life, so that he did not experience death; he could not be found, because God had taken him away. For before he was taken, he was commended as one who pleased God.
By faith, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going. By faith he made his home in the promised land like a stranger in a foreign country; he lived in tents, as did and, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and builder is God.

By faith, even though he was past age - and her-self was barren - was enabled to become a father because he considered him faithful who had made the promise. And so from this one man, and he as good as dead, came descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sand on the seashore.
By faith, when God tested him, offered as a sacrifice. He who had received the promises was about to sacrifice his one and only son, even though God had said to him, "It is through that your offspring will be reckoned." reasoned that God could raise the dead, and figuratively speaking, he did receive back from death.
By faith blessed and in regard to their future.
By faith, when he was dying, blessed each of''s sons, and worshipped as he leaned on the top of his staff.
By faith, when his end was near, spoke about the exodus of the Israelites from Egypt and gave instructions about his bones.
By faith, parents hid him for three months after he was born, because they saw he was no ordinary child, and they were not afraid of the king's edict.
By faith, when he had grown up, refused to be known as the son of, s daughter. He chose to be ill-treated along with the people of God rather than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a short time. He regarded disgrace for the sake of Christ as of greater value than the treasures of Egypt, because he was looking ahead to his reward. By faith he left Egypt, not fearing the king's anger; he persevered because he saw him who is invisible. By faith he kept the Passover and the sprinkling of blood, so that the destroyer of the firstborn would not touch the firstborn of Israel.
By faith because she welcomed the spies, was not killed with those who were disobedient.
