Activities and Games

Activity 1: What on earth are they up to? (20 mins plus time for wall frieze)

Aim

To revise the exit of the Israelites from Egypt; their progress through the wilderness; consider the impact on the surrounding nations and thus our influence on others' perception of God.

Equipment Needed

- One copy of the Quotations sheet per student
- maps of the exodus and surrounding nations (see senior activity book)
- pens
- (For the freize) large sheets of paper
- · paper and colouring pens

Instructions

- 1. Explain to the class that they are the lookout for Jericho and have taken great interest in Israel ever since they heard that a man called Moses was doing amazing things in Egypt. They have gone on to track their journeys and lives, reporting regularly back at Jericho.
- 2. Discuss the events from slavery to the end of the wilderness wandering and draw up a list of the things they would have seen or heard.
- 3. Either as a whole group or in pairs, think of a catchy headline for each of these events.
- 4. Put these headlines in the order that they would have happened.
- 5. Discuss how other nations would have reacted to this news. To help understand the importance read the verses on the Quotations sheet.
- 6. Select one person to shout out the headlines (like a town-crier) while the rest, imagining they live in south Canaan, mime to show their reaction to the news.
- 7. If there is time, produce a wall frieze of the events with stick men or emoticons denoting the feelings of the people concerned..

Extension activity - Discussion

Israel were being observed because of what God had done for them. People's perception of God, and maybe their first experience of God, was through the behaviour and attitude of Israel. What are the parallels for us? Do we show God to people? How? Does it affect our worship? What happens when we too get it wrong?

It's more than 1,400 years before the birth of Jesus and we live in the land of Canaan. In fact we live in a city called Jericho: a city in the middle of a big grove of palm trees, in the plain of Jordan. Sounds good but there's a problem. Just over the River Jordan is the land of Moab and guess who you'll find there - not just the Moabites but a new group of peole - the Israelites! Who? You might well ask. Apparently, they originally came from Mesopotamia but aout 470 years ago a man called Abraham moved to live in Canaan. There are rumours that they think that they have been promised this area. That's a bit too close for comfort - especially as we're the first city on the west of the Jordan! I know what you're thinking though - they're only slaves, what's the worst they can do? Well - that's what Pharoah thought - 'they're only slaves' and look at the mess he got himslf in, assuming the rumoutrs are true.

That's enough from me though - let's go and see what the look out has managed to find out....

Exodus 15:11-16 from The Song of Moses

Who among the gods is like you, Lord?

Who is like you majestic in holiness, awesome in glory, working wonders? You stretch out your right hand, and the earth swallows your enemies. Activity 2 Pattern Pairs (20 mins)

Aims

To review the ways that God delivered his people by comparing New Testament and Old Testament parallels through a game of Pairs.

Equipment Needed

- One Pattern Pairs sheet each, for a pair or a large copy for the class to work together. Instructions
 - 1. Stick the Pattern Pairs sheet or print onto card and cut into individual cards for the game
 - 2. Share the cards out giving Old and New Testament cards equally. (To make things a little easier for the students you could give them out in pairs)
 - 3. Get the class to look up their verses and write on the other side briefly, what the verse is about for the Old Testament cards and how it is relevant to us for the New Testament cards
 - 4. Spread all the cards on a table with the verses facing up and play Pairs. (Take it in turns to turn over two cards. If they are a pair you keep them if not you turn them back over in exactly the same place for the next person. The winner is the one with the most pairs)

Extensions

- Repeat the same exercise but this time looking at parallels for patterns of worship based on the tabernacle and the laws.
- Talk about why we can draw these parallels. Try to bring out the lesson that people don't change in their behaviour but God is consistent with his care for them/us.
