8. To show which tribes went with Rehoboam and which went with Jeroboam - that the kingdom would be divided
9. He threatened to treat them worse than his father had treated them.

Equipment needed

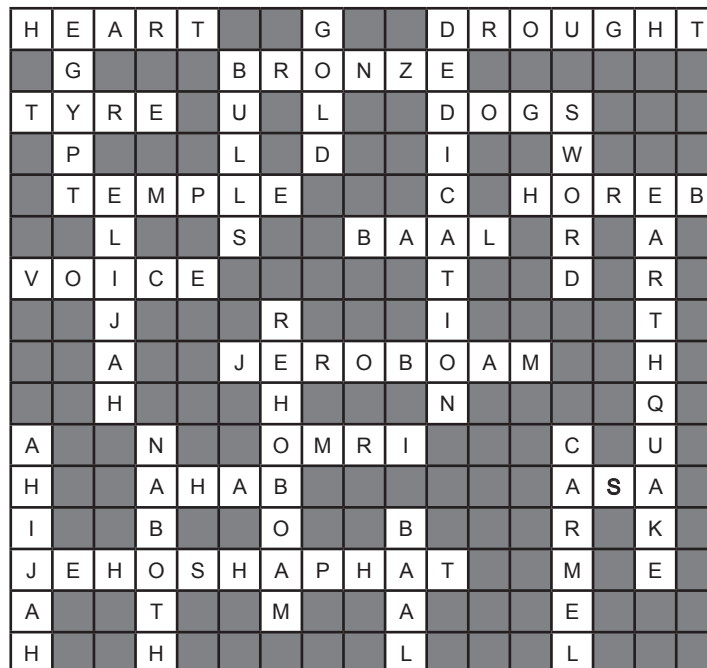
One crossword per student

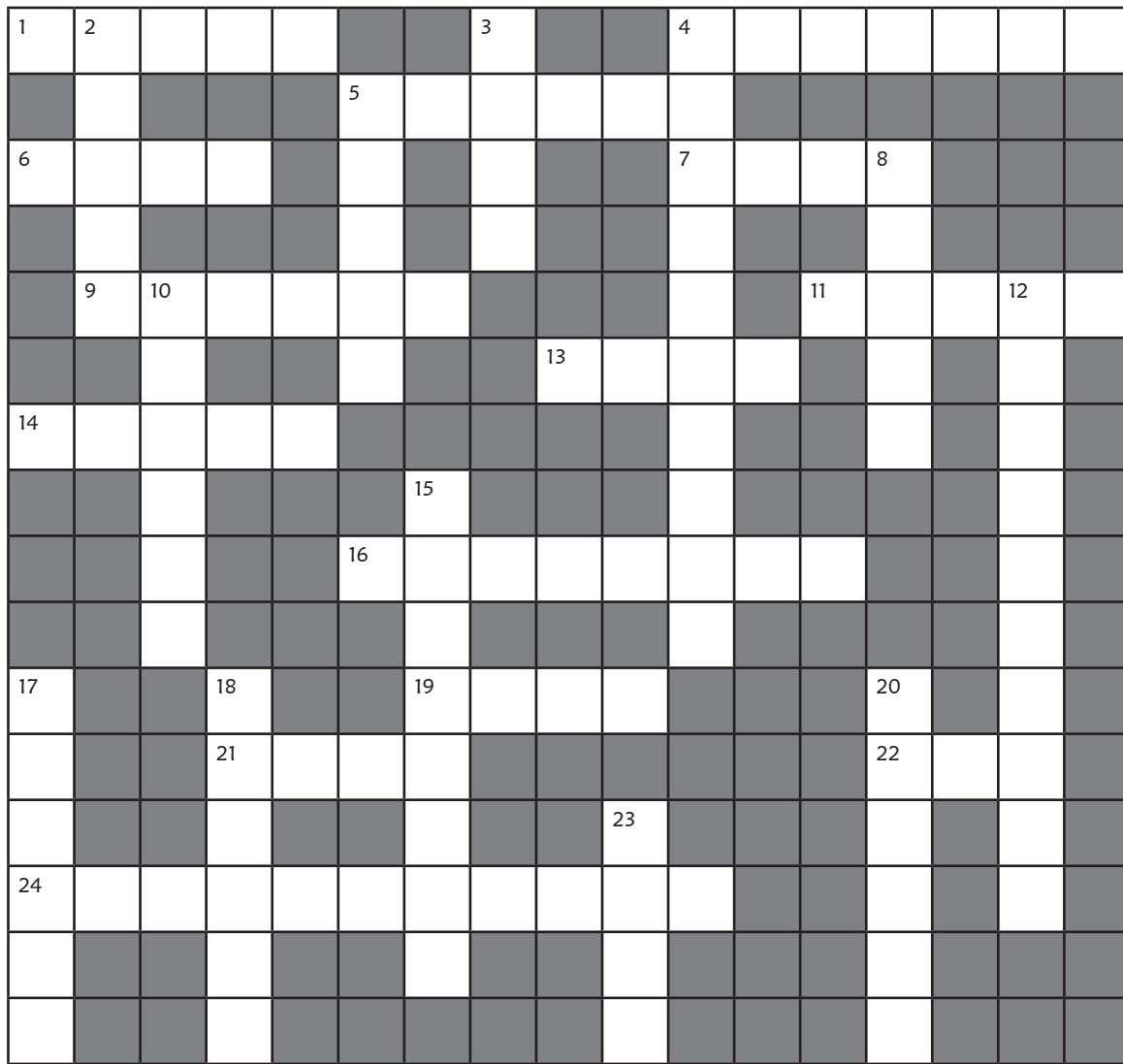
One pen per student

Activity 2: Categories (25 minutes)

Aim

To revise the lives of Solomon, Rehoboam, Jeroboam, Jehoshaphat, Elijah and Ahab.

Equipment needed

One copy of the character cards, cut up
Pens

Instructions

1. Divide the class into two groups.
2. Give each group three character cards.
3. Each group now has 5 minutes to write down 10 statements about each person making sure the opposing group does not hear.
4. Team 1 tells team 2 the name of the character at the top of one of their cards.
5. Team 2 now has 60 seconds to try to guess the ten statements that team 1 has written down. As they call out their answers they should tick them on the sheet.
6. After 60 seconds, team 2 tells team 1 their score and reads any unguessed statements.
7. Play now reverts to the opposite team. The process is repeated through all six characters.
8. The team with the most points is the winner.

You may want to adjust the timings given in the game to suit the ability of the group.
