Activities and Games

Activity 1: Matching Old and New

Aim

To re-enforce that the New Testament is based on the Old; to stress that early Acts was to convert the Jews to Jesus and that much of the argument is based in the Old Testament. (Extension – To bring out the personal relevance of the Old Testament)

Equipment needed

- One copy of the Old Testament statement sheet per student, cut up
- One copy of the reasons sheet per student cut up (can be printed from website)
- To make it easier, the different sheet could be photocopied or printed onto a different colour.
- Glue
- · Large sheets of paper

Instructions

- Each student is given a pack of the 20 statements, shuffled. (Quotations are NIV)
- Students should match the Old Testament quotation to the reason why it was quoted in the New Testament and then stick their answers in place.
- When students have had sufficient time, go through the answers emphasising the key points being made.
- Discussion point Why is there so much emphasis placed on the Old Testament?

Extension Activity

Students select 4 of the quotations and use them to show why Jesus is important to them -i.e. 'This helps my faith because...'

Reasons

To show that Judas should be replaced by another disciple.

To show they were not drunk on the Day of Pentecost but it was the power of the Holy Spirit.

To show that Jesus must die and then be raised from the dead. Jesus knew God would raise him.

To show that Jesus is exalted to be with God.

To show that the Jews should listen to Jesus and repent, or face the consequences.

To show that God had made a covenant with Abraham which involved Jesus.

To show that Jesus had to be crucified before he could become the way to salvation.

To show that although Jesus and now His followers were being persecuted, they realised it was only according to the plan of God, to whom they should pray for strength.

To show that Jesus is like the living stone chosen by God. We should be built into his temple as living stones.

To show that people who do not obey Jesus will fall.

Activity 1: Matching Old and New

Activity 2: Diamond Nine

Aim

To consider different aspects of the early church activities and think through which aspects of a Christian life may be seen as more important.

Equipment

- One set of diamonds per student (can be printed from website)
- Scissors
- A4 paper
- Glue

Instructions

- Each student should cut out their diamonds so that they can arrange them on the A4 sheet.
- Explain that the book of Acts deals with the foundation of the early church. The diamonds list some of their activities.
- Get them to discuss which things would have been important in establishing the early church. They don't have to agree but should listen to each other.
- They should then place their diamonds in order of their priority, as shown in the diagram above
 where the top diamond is the most important thing and the bottom one is the least important.
 When they are happy with the order they should stick them in position. There is no correct
 answer so be prepared to accept what the students think so long as they can give reasons for
 their choices.
- Depending on the age of the students, they should write reasons for that placement around the side. Encourage students to use supporting quotations.
