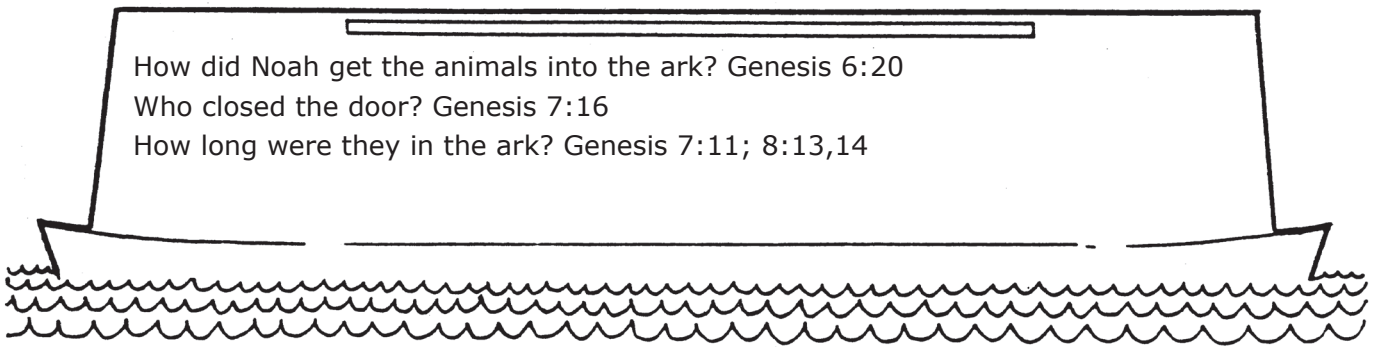

What was the world like after the flood?

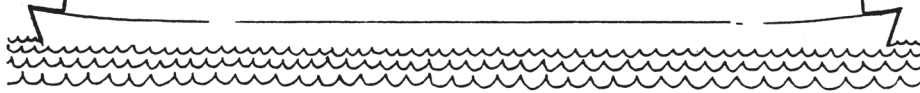
The Return of Jesus - Matthew 24:36-41

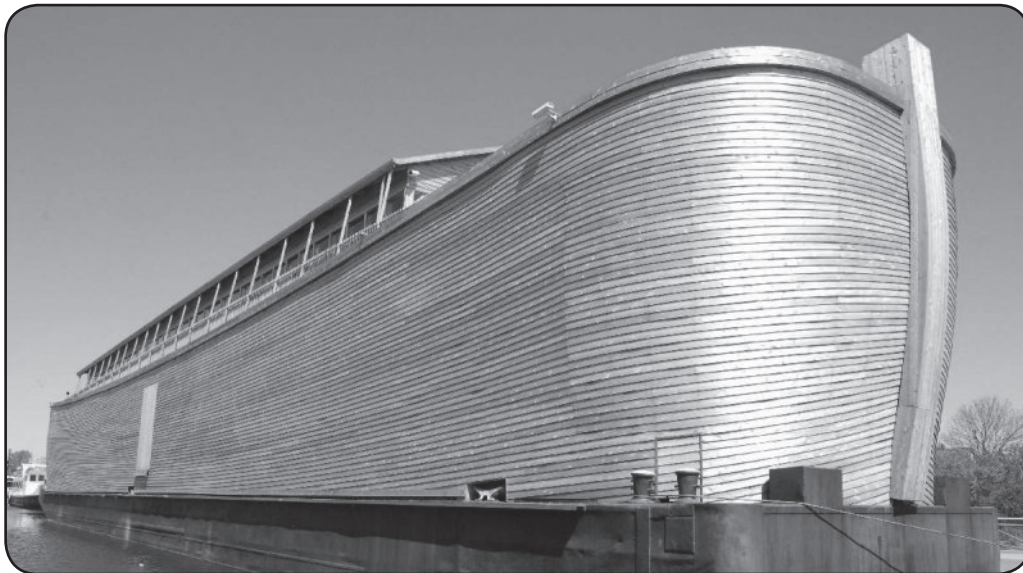
What saves us like the Ark saved Noah and his family?

Digging Deeper - Promises to a New World

Read Genesis 8:20-9:1 and 9:11-16

What promises did God make in these verses and how do we know God still keeps them?

Do you think God had cleansed all the evil from the world? (8:21)

What two things did God want Noah and his sons to do? (9:1)

Now read Genesis 11:1-4. Find out what Noah's descendants wanted to do and two reasons they were they doing it?

Read v 5-9 to find out what God thought about this, what he did, and how it solved what he really wanted.

The picture below is of a Ziggurat, which is what historians think the tower of Babel may have been like. They were built around the time of the events in Genesis to honour false gods. None have been found intact but this picture is based on a contemporary description.
