
Rahab had amazing faith in God. Look in Joshua 2 for evidence of what she knew about God before she met the spies, and how she'd learned it.

Divide the story into about 3 parts and do a simple cartoon sketch of each part. Use a huge sheet of paper and do the sketches together as a group. Instead of writing what people said, write what they were thinking instead. Does everyone in your group agree on what people were thinking?

Look at the thoughts you have written down. Have you ever had those thoughts? What was happening to you when you had them?



HOW were the ways in which Rahab and Joshua learned of God different?


DO you think it matters to God what our backgrounds are?

Make yourself a scarlet cord or ribbon. Use it as a bookmark to mark the passage which tells you of the promise. Or wear it as a necklace or bracelet to remind you every day of God's promises to you.



Digging Deeper

The promised land

If you don't know how the Israelites entered the land, read Joshua 3.

We talk of the land of Israel at this time as the 'Promised land' but that actual expression isn't used much in the Bible.

Who was the land promised to? Hebrews 11.9

Who else? Exodus 3:17 and Numbers 10:29

Which of these people received the promise? Hebrews 11:13 and Joshua 21:43-45

Do you think God will keep his promise to Abraham? Can you be included in the promises? Hebrews 11:39-40 will always
