
Isaiah 5

Digging Deeper

Remind yourself which period of history we are talking about. Where did Isaiah live and in whose reigns? Look at Isaiah 1:1 and use the time chart at the front of the workbook.

What do we know about Isaiah himself?

Read Isaiah 6 to find the answer to these questions.

What do you think Isaiah thought about the way many of his countrymen were living? (v5)

What did Isaiah see in a vision? (v1-3) Where was he and when was it? (v4) (v1)

How did it make him feel? (v5)

What happened next? (v7-8) What do you think this meant?

What did God want and what did Isaiah say? (v8-9)

Do you think the people were going to listen? (v9-10) and how long was Isaiah to go on preaching? (v11-12)

What can you find out about Isaiah's family? Chapter 1:1 (this Amos wasn't the other prophet), chapters 7:3 and 8:3. Something he had to do (chapter 20)

Some people think that Hebrews 11:37 refers to Isaiah when it talks of 'some being sawn in two' but there is no evidence that he was.
