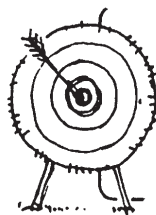

A word about the word

Some people use John 1:1-5 to try to prove the trinity, and some translations try to make it sound as if the Word is a person - Jesus.

The Greek word for 'Word' is logos. It means something that is spoken, and also the thoughts behind the words. John is referring back to creation, formed by the word of God (2 Peter 3:5). Now, in the Lord Jesus, there is a new beginning, a new creation, and all God's nature and power were 'made flesh' in him.

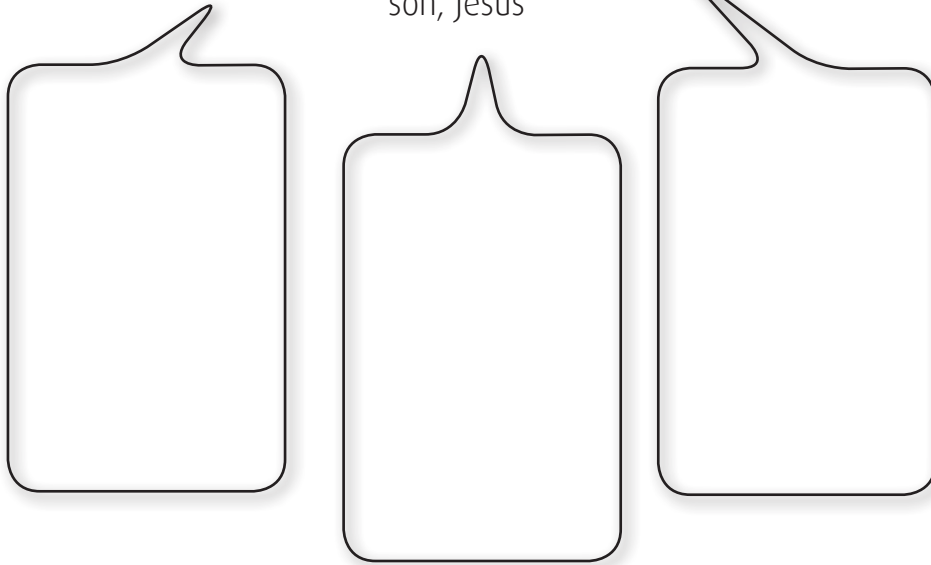
Similar language is used about wisdom in Proverbs 8:14-30.
