
John 4

Digging Deeper - Samaritans

Why were the Samaritans despised?

First of all look on a map of Israel to see where the area is. The town Samaria used to be the capital of the old kingdom of Israel. Read 2 Kings 17:24-28 to find out what happened to the people after the king of Assyria deported most of them.

In the time of Jesus the Samaritans were a mixed race of Jesus and Gentiles.

Luke 9:51-55 tells us a bit more about how the Jews and the Samaritans regarded each other. Not long after this Jesus tells the parable that we know as 'The Good Samaritan' in Luke 10:25-37.

Why does Jesus tell this parable? (v29)

Think about the Samaritan in the parable.

- He saved the life of a man who had no hope.
- He was 'despised and rejected' (Isaiah 53:3)
- He went away and was coming back.
- Who do you think is the best 'neighbour' we could have?

(If you want to study it further, you will find a lot more similarities between the parable and the work of Jesus. What is the significance of Jerusalem? And Jericho? Which way would the Samaritan have been travelling?)
