

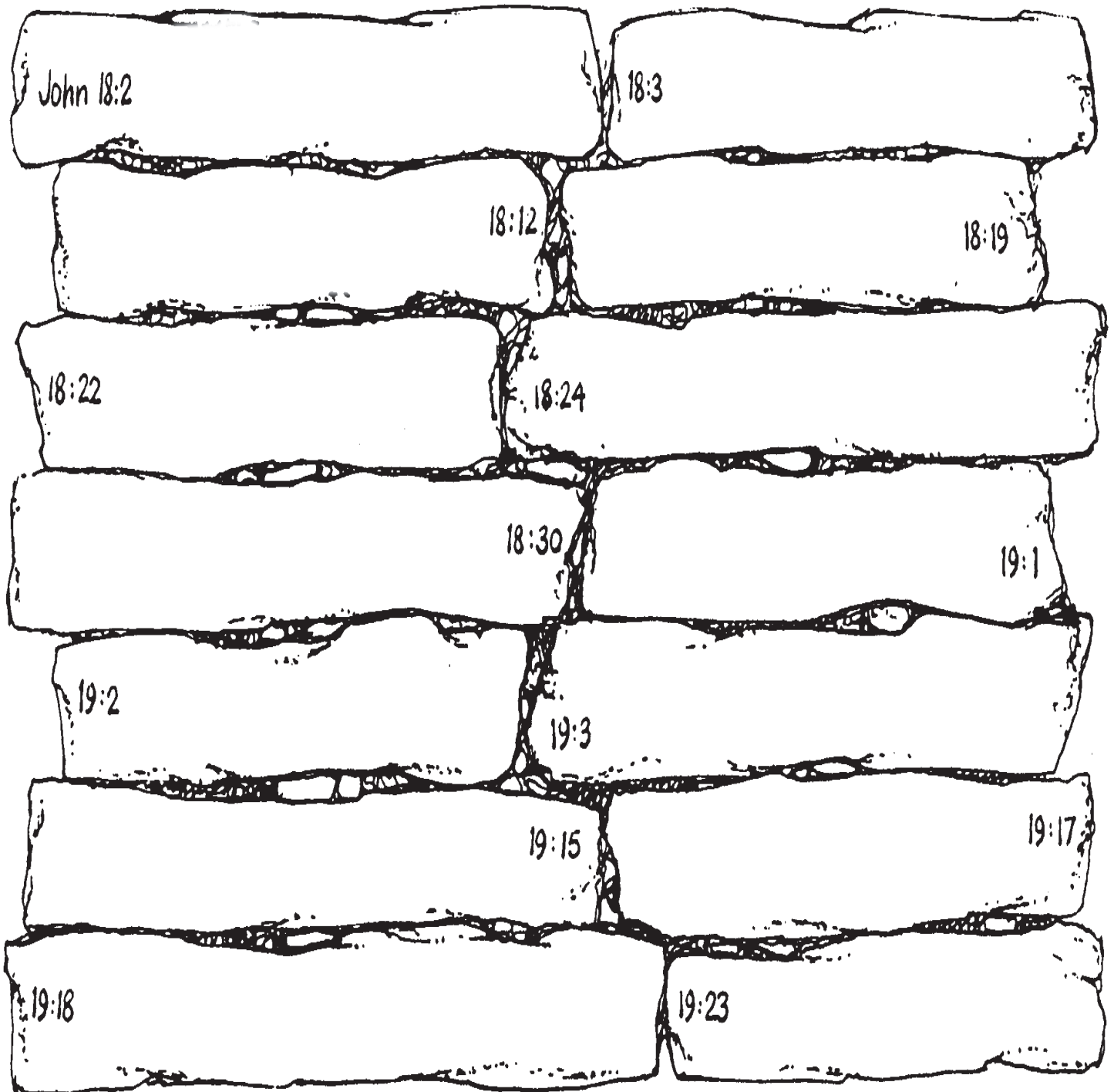
John 18 and 19

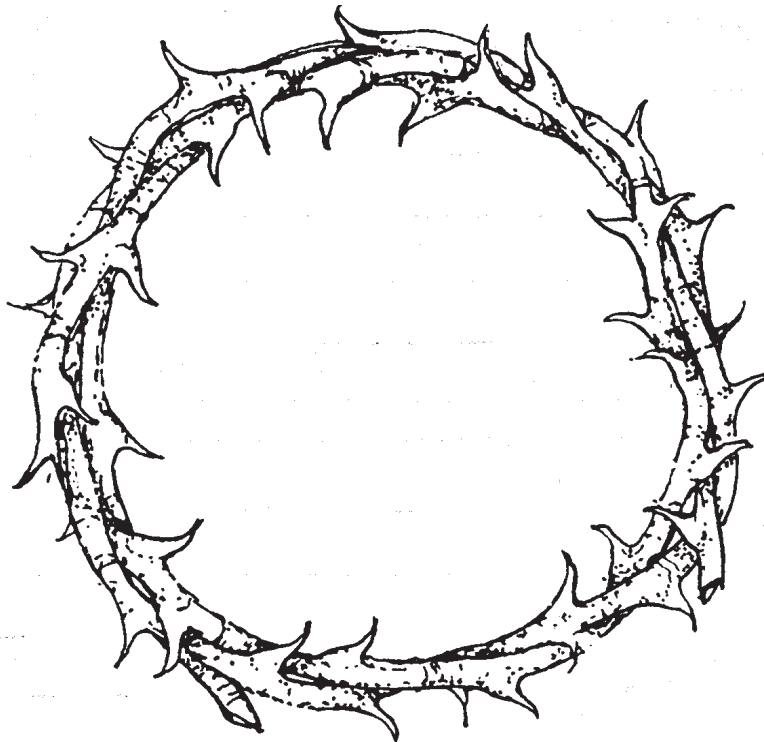
