Think about how much it means to you that the gospel was preached to every nation. What does this tell you about what your attitude to others from different races and backgrounds should be?

In Genesis God told Abraham that all nations would be blessed through him. Can you make a link between God's promise and this lesson about Peter?

Peter had to completely re-think many lessons. Eating unclean meat was something nobody in his whole community would do. It must have been very shocking for him to even think about. Sometimes the things God asks us to do are really hard and go against what those around us think is the right thing to do. Can you think of anything that the Bible teaches us is right which your friends would find unacceptable? What about the moral behaviour which is expected of us? How would you defend your attitude to your friends? Talk in your group about situations like this and how you would deal with them.

Digging Deeper
