- The first five books of the Bible are believed to be written by Moses - look at Joshua 8:32 in a modern translation. In some Bibles they are called the first, second, etc. books of Moses.

- Today the Jews call these books the Torah. It is read in the synagogue in the course of a year.
- Sometimes these books are called the Pentateuch. Why might this be?

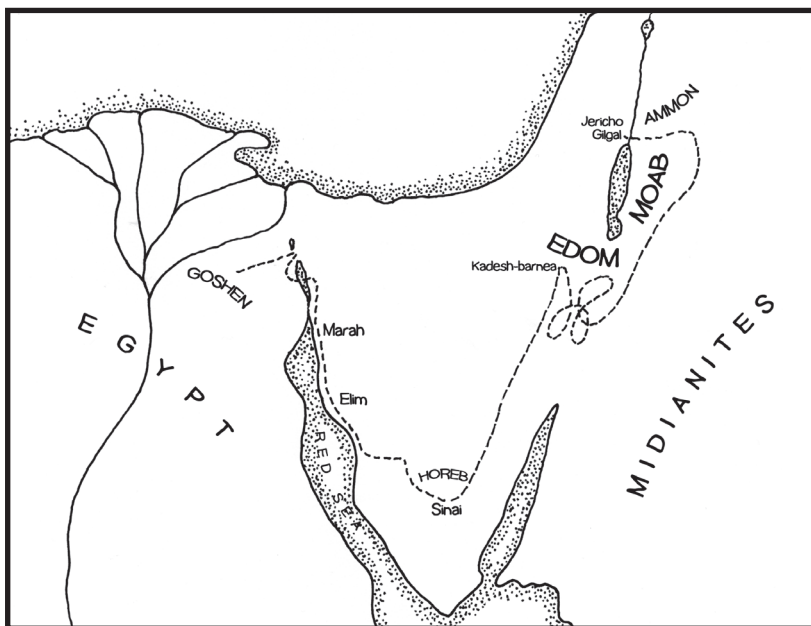
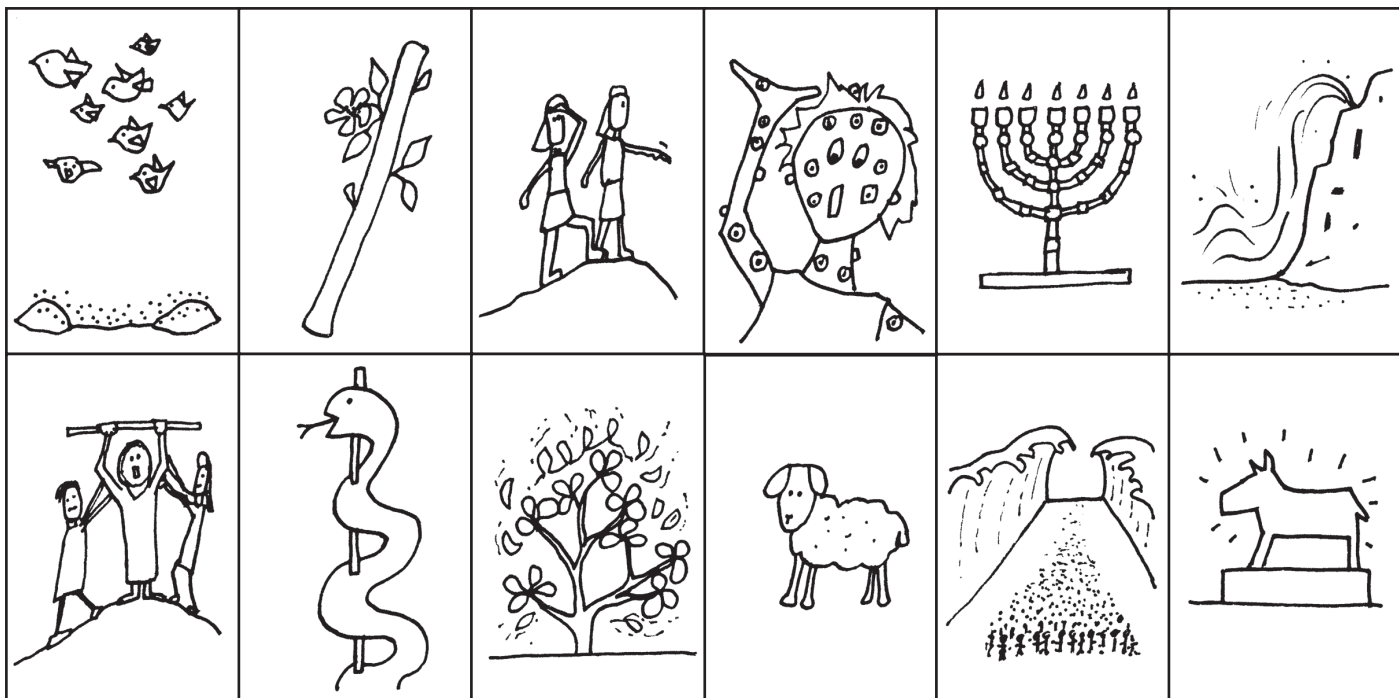
