



Make a boat from paper or card. An A4 envelope (9 x 12 ins) is ideal.


Glue or staple the ends together to form a sharp prow and stern.

The bottom will then become a gently curved inner deck.


Use this pattern to make a small boat.

Cut along the lines to separate the items of cargo.


Place these inside the large boat.














Draw lines from the sentences to the right picture




- \*There was a gentle breeze so they set sail.
