Checklist of the 10 names: Reuben, Levi, Judah, Dan, Naphtali, Gad, Asher, Issachar, Zebulun, Benjamin

Brothers

The last son alphabetically has a wide belt with horizontal stripes.

Levi has horizontal stripes on his tunic.

Dan has vertical stripes on his belt.

Gad has a short coat over his tunic.

The brother with vertical strips on his tunic is Issachar.

Benjamin is the shortest brother.

Naphtali wears the same as Reuben but has no stripes.

Judah has no coat and no stripes.

The first son alphabetically has a beard but no moustache.

The oldest son has stripes on his head-dress. The biggest sack belongs to the brother with vertical stripes on his head-dress.

> The brother with horizontal stripes on his tunic has the smallest sack.

The sack which has spilled belongs to the tallest brother. (Use a ruler if you like!)

The sack with stitching at the opening belongs to the brother with the longest coat.


The brother with a long belt folded over at his tummy has horizontal stripes on his sack

The one with a darker sack has pockets in his tunic.

The sack with a band around it belongs to the brother with vertical stripes on his tunic.

The brother with a pointy beard has vertical stripes on his sack.

The fattest brother has mended a tear in his sack.
