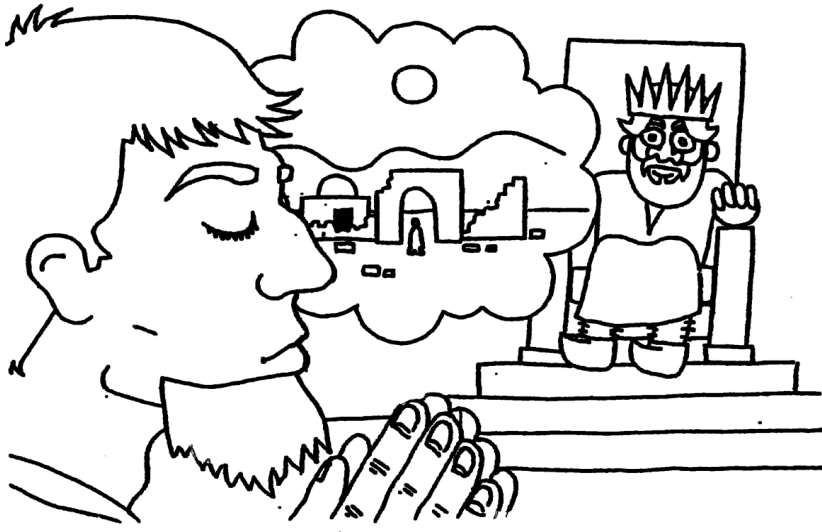
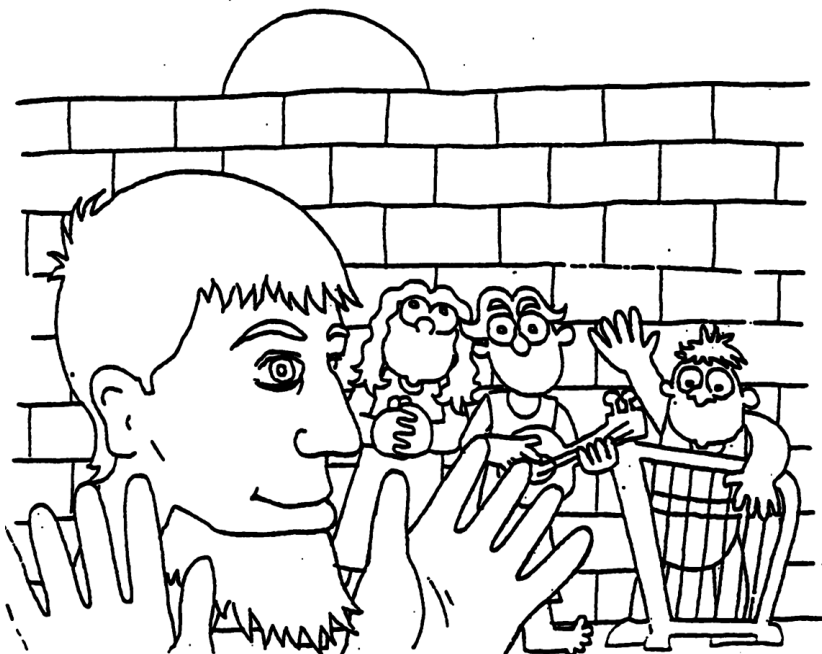
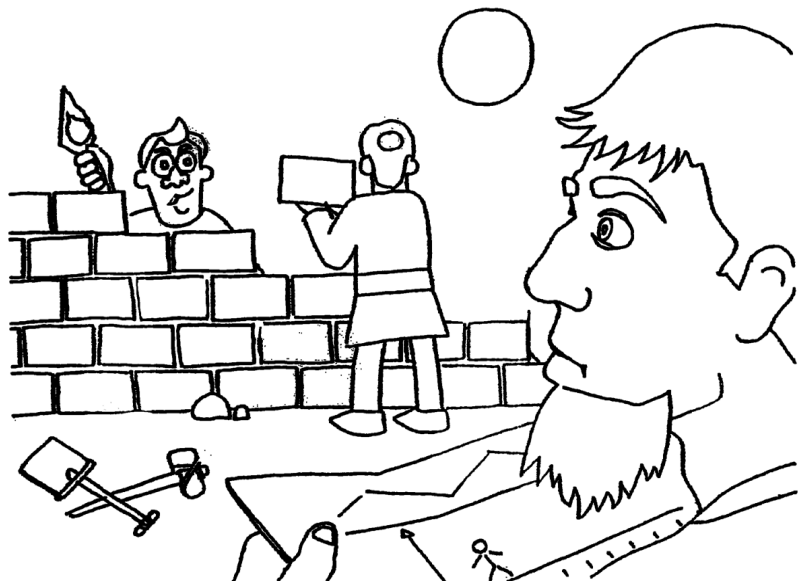

When Nehemiah heard these things, he sat down and wept. For some days he mourned, **lasted/fasted** and **prayed/said** before the God of heaven.

So the king asked him, 'Why does your face look so **sad/happy** when you are not ill? This can be **nothing/something** but **happiness/sadness** of heart.

He was very much afraid.

Then the king said to me, 'What is it you want?' Then he **prayed/stayed** to the God of heaven, and **answered/asked** the king, 'If it pleases the king and if your servant has found favour in his sight, let him send me to the **city/village** in Judah, where my fathers are buried so that I can **reburn/rebuild** it.

He asked for a **letter/book** to Asaph, keeper of the king's **garden/forest** so he would give him **bricks/timber** to make the beams for the **gates/windows** of the citadel by the temple and for the **village/city** wall and for a **tower/residence**.

He went to **Jerusalem/Jericho** and after staying there **five/three** days he set out during the **day/night** with a few **men/horses**.

Then he said to them, 'You see the trouble we are in: **Jerusalem/Jericho** lies in ruins, and its **gardens/gates** have been burned with fire. Come let us **rebuild/reburn** the wall of **Jericho/Jerusalem**, and we will no longer be in **disgrace/disgust**'.

When Sanballat heard that we were **rebuilding/knocking down** the wall, he became **happy/angry** and was greatly incensed. He **helped/ridiculed** the Jews.

So they began to **rebuild/knock down** the wall till **part/all** of it reached half its height, for the **people/children** worked with all their heart.

Those who carried **materials/food** did their work with one hand and held a **weapon/fork** in the other and each of the **cooks/builders** wore his **apron/sword** at his side as he worked. But the man who sounded the **cymbals/trumpet** stayed with Nehemiah.
