

## Some references and answers for lessons 42-48 and Quiz Week

Lesson 42. 1 Samuel 8:4-22

Word Jumble - sons to be his charioteers; grain for his officials; fields for his attendants; you to be his slaves; daughters to be perfumers; donkeys for himself.

Lesson 43. 1 Samuel 9:1-10 and 15-22; 10:1 and 15-22; 11:15 Saul was taller.

Path Finder - Kish had lost his donkeys; He sent his son and servant; They found the donkeys nowhere; Samuel said 'God told me you were coming' and 'Stay with me for the feast'; At Mizpah they cast lots to see who would be king and God chose Saul to be king.

Lesson 44. 1Samuel 13:1-7 and 19-23; 14:1-23

Path finder - The Philistines were enemies of the Israelites; The Philistines had a garrison on a rocky crag; Only a few Israelites had iron weapons; Saul and his people were afraid of the Philistines; Jonathan wanted to fight them; His armour-bearer said he would go with him; They trusted God; The Philistines said 'Come up'; God helped Jonathan win. The secret of Jonathan's success - He trusted in the Lord.

Lesson 45. 1 Samuel 15:35; 16 Acrostic - missing words (order as in the acrostic) - Abinadab, Eliab, rejected, Ramah, oil, Jesse, Shammah, sheep, Samuel. Down word - Bethlehem. Crack the Code - A man after God's own heart.
