



Digging Deeper

Dan - a mobile tribe

Samson had tried to save his tribe from the Philistines, but in the end the Danites gave up trying to fight them.

Look at Judges 18:1-13, 27-30 to see how they captured a city in the far north of Israel, and renamed it. The ruins of the city are still there.
