


Do these look like today's headlines? Or are they from Elijah's time? Things like droughts, disasters, cruelty and suffering are not new. They have been happening for thousands of years.


What do you think were people's reactions when Elijah announced that there would be a drought?






Read in 1 Kings 17:17-24 about the time Elijah spent with the widow at Zarepheth.

# **Digging Deeper**

### What is a prophet?
