

Digging Deeper

Nineveh

Nineveh was later the capital of Assyria. Find it on a map.

The Assyrians were a very cruel nation and soon after Jonah went to them they returned to their barbaric ways.

What did Hosea warn the people of Israel would happen to them if they carried on worshipping idols? Look in Hosea 10:5-6. (Samaria was in Israel and Ephraim is what Hosea often called Israel)

What happened next? Find out by reading 2 Kings 17:1-6. (The NIV Study Bible has several pages about the Assyrian invasion with some maps if you want to find out more about it)

What did Nahum warn Nineveh would happen to them because of what they had done to Israel? Nahum 1:1 and 14; 3:1.

(In Nahum's time, Nineveh was the capital of Assyria and represented the whole of Assyria)

In 612 BC, Assyria fell to an alliance of the Babylonians, the Medes and the Scythians.

The city of Nineveh was enormous - it took Jonah days to walk across it and chapter 4 tells us that it had over 120,000 inhabitants. Historians think that it was at least 14 km in circumference. Some think that it was one of 4 cities joined together which would have been about 100km in circumference! Nineveh's huge population makes us realise just how severe God's

punishment on them would have been.
