Can he help me?

Matthew 8; 9:1-13

Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory. Ephesians 3:20, 21

In this lesson we are going to look at ways Jesus solves problems. Look up each passage and then finish off the square. For each incident, think about what is being helped, how, and why the help is given.

Do any of the other incidents include acts of faith?

What happens in chapter 8:26? How does this compare?

What lessons are there for your own life from these verses?

Digging Deeper

Mark and his gospel

The miracles you have looked at in this lesson have all been taken from Matthew's Gospel and as you can see Matthew has chosen to group them all together in a few chapters, maybe as he did with the sayings of Jesus – what we call 'The sermon on the mount' In digging deeper in lesson 73 we learnt a bit about the man, Matthew.

Now find out a bit about Mark

Who was he? Acts 12:11-12; 12:25; 13:4-5 1 Peter 5:13 (Peter befriended him and called him his 'son' and probably told him much of what was in the gospel) Mark 14:51-52 (this man may have been Mark).

His gospel

Look through Mark chapter 1 (It's best to use the AV for this exercise) and see how often the word immediately (or something similar) is used. It is a very 'punchy' book.

Now use a more modern version so you can see the headings and see how many miracles of healing and acts of service are recorded in the first 10 chapters. Mark wanted to show us that Jesus came to serve people. Readings this week: 5 Matthew 8:1-17 M Matthew 8:18-34 T Matthew 9:1-17 W Matthew 9:18-38 Th Matthew 15:21-39 F Matthew 20:29-34 5 Luke 5:12-32
