## 20 Know that God is there The return of the exiles - Ezra, Nehemiah and Esther




This is a picture of Cyrus the great, who allowed the Jews to return home. His decree is recorded in Ezra 1:1-4.

The cylinder of Cyrus (below) is in the Bristish Museum. It records 'I returned the images of the gods, who had resided there [i.e. in Babylon], to their places and I let them dwell in eternal abodes. I gathered all their inhabitants and returned to them their dwellings'.
